BURNESIDE MILLENNIUM GREEN TRUST

During the last few years the Millennium Green has suffered a number of disruptions due to the flood of 2015 and the subsequent rebuild of Ford Bridge. Some of you will have noticed that the path behind the garages has been resurfaced recently, the surface was washed away by the 2015 flood.

Crocus and native daffodils have also been planted this autumn.

During the next few weeks work will begin tackling the problem of Ash dieback which has affected many of the ash trees along the riverbank. For the safety of users of the Green it is necessary to undertake some selective tree surgery.

The contractor will be leaving cut timber on site which members of the community are welcome to take away.

Whilst the Trustees and volunteers maintain the Green on a day to day basis other work such as grass cutting, tree work etc. has to be done by contractors. All this work involves money and the Trustees wish to thank The Parish Council and The Anglers Inn Trust for their support without which we would be unable to maintain The Green.

They are full of lights, magical journeys, presents and lots of food. One of the adverts even features a young boy circling all the things he wants as presents in a Christmas catalogue.

We are told that Christmas is meant to be a time of giving. For a huge chunk of our society that has been translated into having to spend as much as you can, on presents for everyone. even if you can't really afford it. Ignoring the fact that the recipient might well have much of it already,

In the midst of all this spending and excitement the reason for the gift seems to have been forgotten.

The strapline of all those adverts I mentioned earlier seems to be 'this is what makes Christmas special'. Yet the one thing missing from them all, is what Christmas is about, Jesus's birth.
