

# **Burneside Church & Community** Newsletter May 2025

It always feels like something of a triumph to me to finally arrive in May. We've survived the cold and dark hours of the winter, trudged through the gloom and deprivation of Lent and are finally facing some days that promise lighter evenings and possibilities of sunshine and time to relax and play with family and friends. For me, I guess that feeling is heightened by the sheer joy of getting up before the crack of dawn on May 1st and meeting a group of equally crazy friends on a local hill or mountain top and singing and Morris dancing as the sun rises. This moment is often full of pure joy. A simple celebration of being alive and appreciating the many gifts we have been given and the earth we share. For me, it's a time when I thank God for friendship, for the gifts of music and dancing and for his wonderful creation. The others who share that special moment with me all have their own reasons for being there and together we are a very thankful and excited bunch despite the 4am wakeup call! This year we do this for the first time without one of our number who died last November. That moment will be tinged with sadness and grief as we remember our loss, but we will dance and sing harder to honour her memory.

I've been conscious a lot lately that 'in the midst of life we are in death' (Book of Common Prayer, funeral service) a phrase that acknowledges the inherent connection between life and death, reminding us that death is always a presence, even while we are living. It's been my privilege lately to conduct quite a few funerals and to walk with families as they grieve the loss of their loved ones. We've said goodbye to some huge characters around the Beacon Team in the last few months. In this Easter season we can hold onto the hope that Jesus conquered even that ultimate finality of death by rising to new life and going ahead of us to prepare a place for us in heaven. The promise of the Christian faith is that through faith in Christ we will have the hope of heaven and a life beyond death.

So, on May 1<sup>st</sup> I will be up at 4am and dancing on a hill somewhere in the Kendal area as the sun peeps out over the horizon. We will be celebrating life in all its fulness and I will be giving thanks to God for the many blessings he has given me. Apologies if you awake to the sound of distant, jingling bells and a joyful song on the breeze...

## May 2025 Events Celebrations & Special Days

May Day 1st May May Day is an ancient pagan spring festival, traditionally celebrated across Europe with maypole dancing and the crowning with a floral crown of a May Queen.

World Laughter Day 3rd May The celebration of World Laughter Day is a positive manifestation for World Peace and it builds up a global friendship through laughter.

Star Wars Day 4th May A pun on the date 4th May inspired the phrase May The Fourth Be With You. So this day is now known as Star Wars Day.

May Day Bank Holiday 5th May Held on the Monday closest to May Day

Screen-Free Week 5th May to 11th May Annual event to encourage us to unplug from digital entertainment and spend all that free time playing, reading, daydreaming, creating, exploring, and connecting with family and friends.

World Asthma Day 6th May An annual event organized by the Global Initiative for Asthma with a goal to improve asthma awareness and care around the world.

International Day of Families 15th May A UN designated day to promote awareness of issues relating to families and to increase the knowledge of the social, economic and demographic processes affecting families.

National Children's Day UK 18th May National Children's Day UK is all about the importance of a healthy childhood and protecting the rights and freedoms of children so that they can grow into happy, healthy adults.

World Bee Day 20th May The purpose of World Bee Day is to raise awareness of the importance of pollinators, the threats they face and their contribution to sustainable development.



International Tea Day 21st May A UN designated day to take action to promote the sustainable production and consumption of tea

World Turtle Day 23rd May The aim of World Turtle Day is to bring attention to, and increase knowledge of and respect for, turtles and tortoises, and encourage human action to help them survive and thrive.
