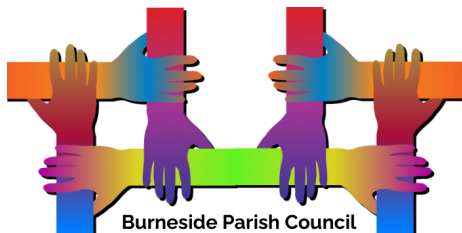

Dear Friends,

I hope you had some time for refreshment over the summer months. I certainly enjoyed the time I was able to spend with my family and friends. Autumn has followed hot on the heels of spring it seems, with a quick glimpse of summer just as the children returned to school!

The beginning of a new school year is often a good time to start new things. Lots of groups seem to relax during August and so in September and October we see everything begin to gather pace again.

As a priest in the Church of England it is part of my vocation (calling) to pray every day. There is an expectation that every priest will pray the 'daily office' which includes prayers and readings each day. There is great flexibility these days about what you can use to help you pray, but I find the simple discipline of the daily office to be helpful and so I usually begin my day with this in my study.

Now that I live next door to a church, I have decided to say my daily office in the church itself on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from the start of October. I'll be there at 9am and it lasts around 15-20 mins. It would be really lovely if you felt able to join me there. Perhaps you might pop in once in a while, or maybe it's something you would appreciate being part of more regularly. There will be no expectation for you to do anything other than just come and enjoy a quiet 20 mins at the start of a busy day thinking and praying about the needs of the world and our local community and hearing words from the Bible.



There will be times of course when diary commitments mean it won't be possible, but I'll make sure that the church is still open at that time on those days.

If none of this appeals to you or is not possible for one reason or another, but you would appreciate a prayer then do send any requests to me by email or on a note through my door and we will include them.

The offer applies to the **Cropper Room, Acland Room** or the **Hoyle Room**.

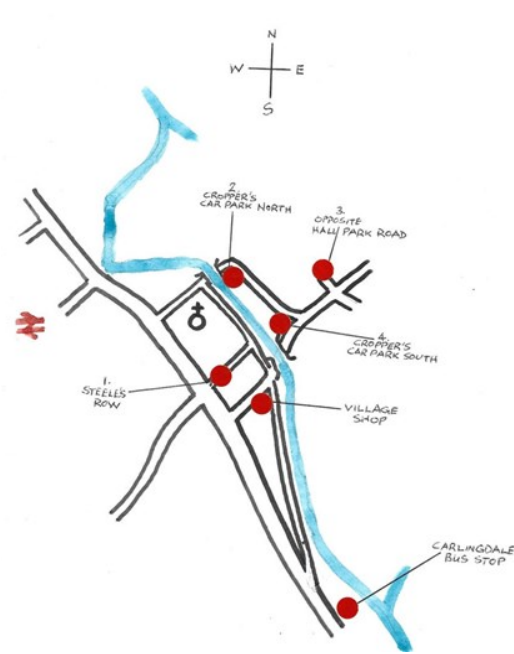
