

Minutes of a meeting of Burneside Parish Council held at St Oswald's Church Room, Burneside, on Tuesday 7th September 2021 at 6.30pm.

Present were Councillors Will Huck (Chairman), Tonia Armer, Julie Huck, Judith Notley Derrick Wade, District Councillors Pat Bell and Hazel Hodgson, 10 members of the public and Parish Clerk Kevin Price. Apologies for absence were accepted from Councillors Paul Senior and Keith Tondeur.

**Public participation:** (Please see full minutes on the website or noticeboards).

An extended public participation was held, so that members of the public could comment on the SLDC Local Plan Review and also any other matters. Comments will be included with the Parish Council response to the review, comments left in the Church corridor and any others that the Council has received will also be included.

**Declarations of Interest:** Councillor Will Huck declared an interest as a School Governor and Councillor Wade for his involvement with the Burneside Residents Association.

**Minutes:** The minutes of the meeting held on 6th July 2021, having been circulated were accepted as a true record and signed by the Chairman.

**Council Vacancies:** There had been some interest shown in the Council Vacancies but no firm expressions of interest yet. There are currently 4 vacancies.

**County and District Councillor's Reports:** Councillor Bell and Councillor Hodgson both spoke of the new Unitary Authority which would come into being in 2023, with a shadow Council to be elected in 2022.

Councillors Will Huck and Judith Notley attended an online meeting arranged by CALC regarding this.

**SLDC Local Plan Review:** A discussion was had by the Council, with comments made on some of the key themes from the review and the submitted development sites. It was resolved that the Chairman and Clerk would collate the comments made by members of the public earlier in the meeting and these will be submitted to SLDC by the due date. The PC response will also include comments made on paper in the Church corridor and any others that the Council has received. The Chairman and Councillor Notley are to attend a meeting with SLDC development regarding the review, along with Natland PC.

The Clerk will ask Geoffrey Marvin if his response has been sent to SLDC as well as to this Council.

**Sewage Capacity and Development:** It was unanimously resolved that this Council will adopt the same policy as Staveley with Ings Parish Council has in place, and oppose all new developments going into the sewage system until it is fit for purpose.

**Updates:** This was deferred until the next meeting.

**Finance:** The Clerk gave a brief update on the Council's finances. A full report for the half year will be given at the next meeting.

**Fence at St Oswald's School:** It was resolved to use the CIL money of £2,723.94 as a grant towards the renewal of the fencing at St Oswald's School. The Clerk will request a receipt for both this and the previous grant made.

**Burneside Residents Association:** An email from Councillor Tondeur regarding the Flood Group meeting had been circulated to Councillors.

**LEGACY FROM THE BIKE 4 BURNESIDE EVENT:** Information had been circulated to all Councillors regarding a project for the bus stop opposite Church and Tony Hill gave some further information surrounding the project to the Council. It was resolved to support this venture.

**Allotments:** The Clerk will send a Grant Application form to Councillor Notley, so funding for this can be applied for.

**Planting of tree in memory of Prince Philip:** An English Apple Tree is to be planted in his memory.

**Memorial bench:** The Clerk said that this is finally moving forward and a template for an agreement between Mrs Batty and the Council has been sent by CCC highways. The exact location and design of the bench has yet to be approved. A target date of the end of this year is being worked towards, to bring the project to a conclusion.

**The Todds footpath:** Stewart Menzies updated the Council on this matter. This path is well used and the alteration of stiles to aid accessibility is considered desirable. The Council gave full support to this project.

### *From the Associate Priest*

Dear Friends,

If you were unfortunate enough to have a burglary at your house, and your Bible was one of the items stolen would you actually miss it? And how keen would you be to replace it?

A young Welsh girl called Mary Jones, who was born in 1784 loved to hear her minister read Bible stories in the Welsh language. When she was nine years old she determined to buy a Bible for herself. It took her six years to save up enough money and then she had to walk 26 miles through the rugged terrain of North Wales to Bala, to buy the precious book. The Revd Thomas Charles of Bala arranged lodgings for Mary and sold her three Bibles for the price of one. He was so inspired by her story and for the need for reduced price Welsh Bibles that he consulted other Church leaders and posed the question – 'If for Wales, why not for the kingdom; and if for the kingdom, why not for the world?' William Wilberforce and other members of the Clapham Sect (a group of influential Christians from Clapham) caught this vision and the end result was that the British and Foreign Bible Society was born – a charity committed to offering the Bible to the world. In 2020 it was estimated that the full Bible is now translated into 704 languages, and the New Testament into 1,551 languages – all because a young Welsh girl wanted her own Bible!

On 6th October the Church remembers William Tyndale who was responsible for the translation into English of the New Testament from the Greek texts and actually getting it printed on the continent. About 18,000 copies were printed and found their way to England. The Bishop of London bought large quantities of them and burned them publicly! Tyndale – taking refuge in Antwerp – began work translating the Old Testament from the Hebrew texts. Various attempts were made to lure him back to England and eventually he was betrayed and captured. He was tried and found guilty of heresy. On 6th October 1536 he was strangled and then burnt at the stake. His dying words were, "Lord, open the King of England's eyes". Let's never forget Tyndale and others who were prepared to put their lives on the line so that we could read God's word in a language which we can understand.

One of the things I noticed during my years of District Nursing was that on the whole the people who seemed to cope best with difficult times were those who had a well-worn Bible at their bedside. Someone once said that Bibles that are falling apart belong to people who are not! October 24th is Bible Sunday. This will be a good opportunity for us all to think about the time we spend reading and studying our Bibles. Do we need to spend more time on this? Would a change of Bible Reading notes help? Would it be good to buy a different translation of the Bible to make it more easily understood? Market Place Books in Kendal has a good range of Bible reading notes and many different Bible translations. Why not go and have a browse?

**Open Forum:** *The following matters were mentioned:*

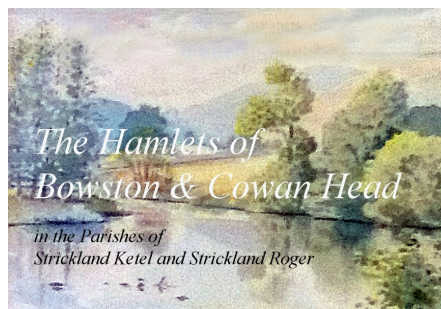
There is no hand rail at the top of Hall Park, by number 107. Councillors will visit and check this out.
